

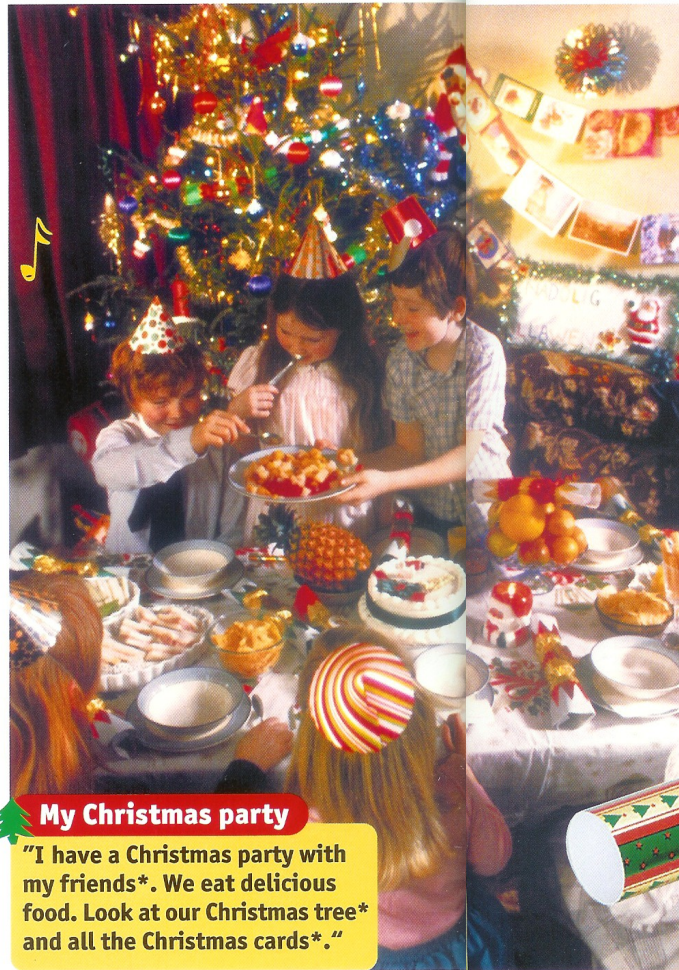

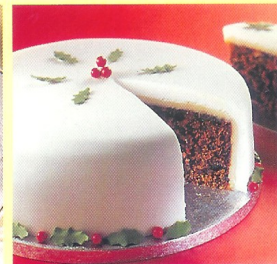
My Christmas party

 "At Christmas, I visit Father* Christmas in his "grotto" in big shops* like Harrods. I tell him what I want for Christmas."

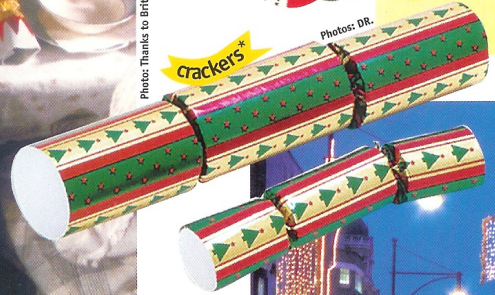
